

Picnic, hike, fish at Jamestown's Fort Getty park

A hike through Fort Getty is a trip through history. Breathtaking photo opportunities present themselves every step of the way in all directions. Fortifications and three bunkers dating back to the turn of the twentieth century when the fort was founded present visitors with panoramic vistas of Narragansett Bay's West Passage.

The RV park and campground overlook the Fox Hill Salt Marsh and Dutch Harbor. Remove the bridges and sailboats on moorings, and visitors could witness the same views as seen by British and Colonial soldiers in the days of the Revolutionary War. A coastal walking trail overlooks rocky shorelines, sculpted by nature for millennia. The Kit Wright Nature Trail across from the campgrounds along the salt marsh offers a stroll through woods and coastal shrubs, making it a bird watchers paradise.

Fort Getty Park is a town-owned recreation facility located along the West Passage shoreline in Jamestown. Used primarily for camping, with accommodations for both tents and recreational vehicles, this 41-acre park is operated and maintained
