Diane Linda (Beaulieu) Drown, 57

Diane Linda (Beaulieu) Drown, 57, of Howland Avenue died Jan. 16, 2006, at home surrounded by friends and family after a brief battle with lung cancer.

Diane was the daughter of the late Dorothy (Collins) and George Beaulieu of Jamestown. She was also the mother of David Alan Drown of Hope Valley and Rachel Ann Drown of Washington, D.C.



Drown was born in Providence on May 23, 1948, and grew up in Fairhaven, Mass. before making Jamestown her home in 1978.

She started her career as a teller for Industrial National Bank on Narragansett Avenue, now Bank of America, and worked her way up the ladder. In 2002, she retired as vice president of corporate strategy. More recently, she volunteered with the Rhode Island Mentoring Partnership to strengthen and expand the Jamestown School mentoring pro-

gram. Drown recruited volunteers and corporate sponsors. She was also a mentor herself. Drown was recently acknowledged for Excellence in Mentoring at the Rhode Island Statehouse by Gov. Donald Carcieri.

She was an ardent collector of art, antiques, rare books and music and had a passion for nature and lunar cycles. She had an unquenchable thirst for knowledge and while working full time earned her bachelor's degree in English literature, a master's degree in industrial labor relations and a second master's in education, all from the University of Rhode Island. Due to her untimely death, Drown was unable to achieve her goal of obtaining a doctorate in education.

Besides her son and daughter, she

leaves brothers, Robert of Brooklyn, N.Y., David of Jamestown, Daniel of Arkansas, George of Saunderstown; and a sister, Roseanne of Florida. Drown also leaves nieces, nephews, her great-niece Kaitlyn Godena.

A Mass will be held at St. Mark Church in Jamestown on Saturday, Jan. 28, at 10 a.m. Immediately following the Mass, David and Rachel Drown welcome friends and family to a celebration of their mother's life at Trattoria Simpatico from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Burial will be private. In lieu of flowers, donations in her memory can be sent to the Jamestown Medical Fund or the Jamestown School Mentoring Program.

Rev. Nigel L. Andrews, 84

The Reverend Nigel Lyon Andrews, 84, died on Jan. 19, 2006 after several months of declining health. Born in Syracuse, N.Y., the son of Paul Shipman Andrews and Hannah Sargent Sessions Andrews, he studied at Pebble Hill School and graduated from St. George's School, Newport, in 1939.

As a student in Yale College, he met and married Constance Doane Young of Newport, who was a student in the Yale University School of Music. Both graduated in the Class of '43. During World War II, he served in the Army Air Transport Command, earning the rank of Captain.

Following the war, he studied and practiced law in Syracuse, N.Y., including a two-year position as law clerk to Judge Edmund Lewis of the New York State Court of Appeals in Albany. While in Syracuse he was founding president of Syracuse Friends of Chamber Music, in association with the distinguished violinist Louis Krasner. Dmitri Mitropoulos, conductor of the Minneapolis Symphony and later the New York Philharmonic, took a personal interest in this new music group and performed and conducted several concerts there.

In 1953, Mr. Andrews left the law to study for ministry in the Episcopal Church at Berkeley Divinity School in New Haven. He later served as a trustee of Berkeley for several terms, and was awarded an honorary degree of Doctor of Divinity. His first parish was St. Ann's, Old Lyme, Conn., where he served for eight years as its first Rector, expanding a small rural mission into a thriving parish with a new church building and parish house. From 1962 to 1979, he served as rector in Trinity Parish, Concord, Mass., during a critical period in which the church grappled with its
