Weather History

July 6, 1893 - A violent tornado killed 71 people on its 40-mile track across northwestern Iowa. Forty-nine people were killed near Pomeroy, where 80 percent of the buildings were destroyed and most leveled to the ground. Photos showed most of the town without a wall or tree standing.

July 7, 1915 - Severe winds and thunderstorms caused heavy damage and 38 deaths in and around Cincinnati, Ohio. Many old buildings were demolished. The steamship "Dick Fulton" was overturned.

BOC trophy on display at yacht museum

The Museum of Yachting in Newport has been selected as the new home for the BOC Trophy for Single-Handed Sailors, which will be on permanent display in the Single-Handed Sailors' Hall of Fame.

The BOC Challenge — a grueling 27,000-mile yacht race was established as the first single-handed around the world race in 1982. Originally conceived by David White, the first challenge was made Nigel Rowe, then CEO of corporate relations for the BOC Group. The BOC trophy has been awarded to single-handed sailing luminaries including

Phillippe Jeantot, Yukoh Tada, Christophe Auguin, Yves Dupasquier, David Adams, Jean-Pierre Mouligne, and Bernard Stamm. The 2006 Museum of Yachting Single-Handed Sailing Hall of Fame inductees are David Adams, Jean-Pierre Mouligne, and Bernard Stamm.

Rowe hand-delivered the trophy to trustees of the Museum of Yachting on June 7. Members of the Single-Handed Sailors' Hall of Fame Nominating and Selection committees were on hand to welcome Rowe and assist with the official trophy installation.

Located at Historic Fort Adams State Park, the Museum of Yachting is open to the public from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., from May 15 to Oct. 31. Call 847-1018.
