Together, the Humane Society of Jamestown, Providence-based Defenders of Animals, and several residents of Jamestown have been working relentlessly to prevent Beavertail State Park from turning into a hunting ground. Last week the Town Council gave the Department of Environmental Management (DEM) their permission to move forward with their plan to allow archery hunting of the parks dozen or so deer begin-

ning this past Monday, Nov. 13. With so few deer in the entire park, their plan has been intensely disputed. When the Town Council of Jamestown approved DEM's proposal for this hunt, the groups immediately filed legal action through their lawyer against DEM and the town of Jamestown. Although the judge concluded that DEM is acting within its authority, the HSJ took every step it felt necessary to stop this hunt.

### Town of Jamestown Notice of Preliminary Public Hearing

A Preliminary Public Hearing will be held for the Norton Reamer two lot Subdivision on Wednesday December 6, 2006 at a meeting of the Jamestown Planning Commission beginning at 7:30 p.m. in the large meeting room of the Jamestown Philomenian Library, 26 North Main Road.

This project consists of a two-lot subdivision being accessed by Hull Cove Farm Road, a private street off Beavertail Road. The project is comprised of Tax Assessors Plat (AP) 12 Lot 29. Said lot proposed for subdivision begins less than 1/10th of a mile (500 feet) south of Bonnet View Drives intersection with Beavertail Road on the east side of Beavertail Road.
