A Partner's in Flight Priority Species

Every spring Jamestown's farms are home to dozens of Bobolinks. Known for their black wings and yellow nape - with songs that sound like R2-D2 from Star Wars - these charismatic birds make a 10,000 mile round trip from South America to breed in Jamestown.

Bobolinks depend on tall, uniform grasses on our working farms to breed and to rear their young. The presence of Bobolinks also indicates a healthy nesting and feeding habitat for other grassland birds including Savannah Sparrow, Cattle Egret, Glossy Ibis and Red-tailed Hawk.

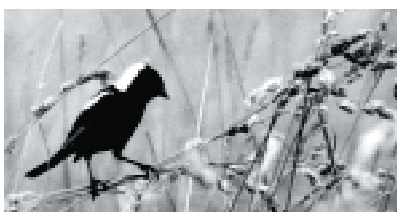
