# FARMLAND UNDER STRESS

Since 1972, Jamestown has lost nearly 40% of its agricultural land. New homes for a growing population have increasingly displaced farms and wildlife.

Today only 452 acres (7.4% of Jamestown) and 9 active farms are remaining. As a result, the community has experienced losses to its agrarian heritage, and farmland dependent wildlife is increasingly threatened by habitat losses.

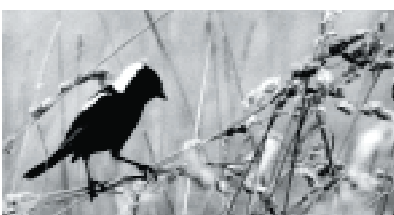
