NOTICE OF PROPOSED PROPERTY TAX RATE CHANGE

The Town of Jamestown proposes to increase its property tax levy to \$16,042,518 in the 2008 budget year; the property tax levy this year is \$15,307,032. THIS IS A PROPOSED INCREASE OF 4.8 %.

It has been estimated that the proposed increase in property tax revenues will result in a property tax rate of \$7.82 (proposed property tax rate) per \$1,000 of assessed valuation, as compared to the current property tax rate of \$9.49 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation. Without revaluation, the proposed increase would have resulted in a property tax rate of \$9.82 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation.

The property tax levy for the 2008 budget year excludes motor vehicles at a tax rate of \$ 14.42 per \$1000 of assessed valuation and retail/wholesale inventory at a tax rate of \$1.51 per \$1000 of assessed valuation in accordance with state law.

A property tax rate of \$7.88 (adjusted current property tax rate) would be needed in the coming budget year to raise the maximum levy authorized by section 44-5-2 of the general laws.

The Town of Jamestown budget will be considered on June 4, 2007, 7:00 p.m., Lawn School, 55 Lawn Ave., Jamestown, R.I.

The above property tax estimates have been computed in a manner approved by the Rhode Island Department of Administration.
