Weather History

June 7, 1972 - Richmond, Va. experienced its worst flood of record as rains from Hurricane Agnes pushed the water level at the city locks to a height of 36.5 feet, easily topping the previous record of 30 feet set in 1771.

June 8, 1966 - A tornado ripped right through the heart of the capital city of Topeka, Kan., killing 16 people and causing 100 million dollars in damage. The tornado, which struck during the evening, cut a path of near total destruction eight miles long and four blocks wide.

Strawberry Fest coming June 16

Savor Smith's Castle's celebrated strawberry shortcake and pay homage to the humble wild strawberry, a favorite of the early colonists and the native Narragansett tribe at the annual Strawberry Festival.

Admission to the Saturday, June 16th event is free. Activities begin at noon and run until 4 p.m. Delicious strawberry shortcake with real whipped cream will be offered at a cost of \$5 for adults, children's half-cake for \$3. Drinks are \$1. The event is sponsored by the North Kingstown Arts Council.

The castle will offer many events and activities for families to enjoy at this historic site. There will be free tours of the first floor of the "castle," a circa 1678 trading post established by Richard Smith, and its grounds, which feature a colonial revival garden.

Entertainment for the day will include an interactive performance by singer Mary King, storytelling from Katie Latimer, and Yorick's Marionette Theatre.

There will be demonstrations on candle dipping, broom making and sewing skills, as well as rug hooking with craftspeople from the Fayerweather Craft Guild. Steinhagen Pottery of Voluntown, Conn. will be selling 18th Century style redware pottery.

Children can make a tussie mussie or hammered flower print to bring home for \$1. Docents in period costume will be on hand to answer questions about the house and its history. The gift shop is brimming with new and unique treasures.
