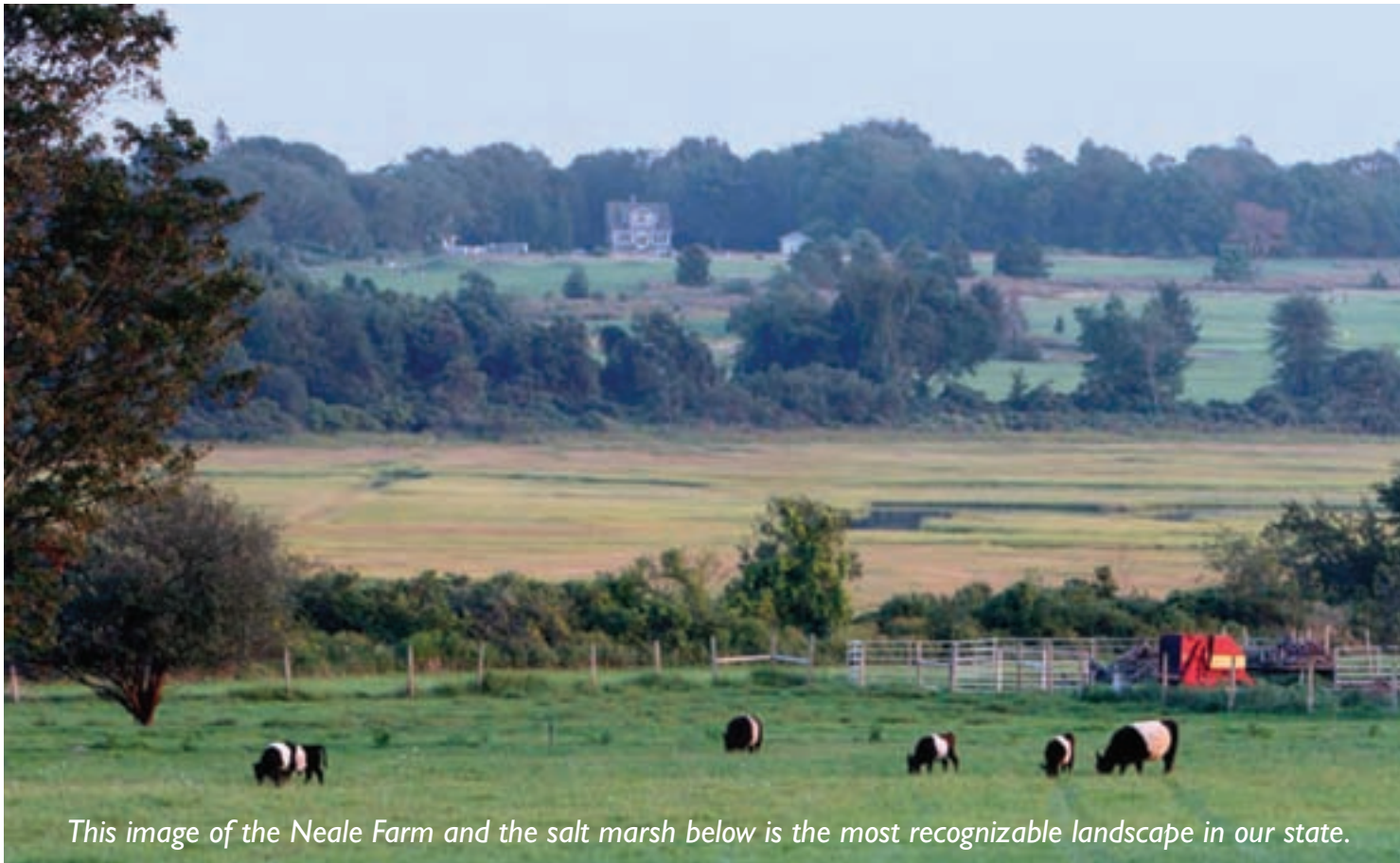

The Neale Farm, owned by Martha and George Neale, is located just north of the Great Creek, and is bounded by North Road and Weeden Lane. The Farm suffered many years of neglect, and Mr. and Mrs. Neale have devoted their free time to restoring it to its current beautiful condition. The Neales' 43 acres is primarily pastureland and home to approximately 50 Belted Galloways (black with white "belts"), an ancient breed of beef cattle developed during the 16th century in the former Galloway District of Scotland.

We will succeed in protecting this historic farm, along with the Dutra and Ceppi Farms, only with the generous support of every member of our community.
