**Help with weekly chores at the community farm**

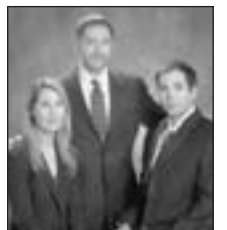
Volunteers are needed to help with harvesting fresh vegetables at the community farm each Tuesday and Thursday afternoon from 6 p.m. to dusk.

**K KARN'S Law Group LEGAL TIP**



An adult social host can be held liable for injuries caused by a minor who is served alcohol at a party, the South Carolina Supreme Court has ruled.

The court ruled in two cases involved separate incidents stemming from unrelated social events. In the first case, a 19-year-old died in a one-car accident after drinking at a party where alcoholic beverages were available to all guests. Her mother sued the hosts of the party.

In the second case, a 19-year-old guest who consumed alcohol at a business-related function got into a car accident, killing the guest and a third party in another vehicle. The third party's estate sued the host of the function.

The Court allowed both cases to proceed, each against the particular host of the function.
