The Ceppi Farm, owned by Jean and Peter Ceppi, is located on the corner of Eldred Ave. and East Shore Road. This 14-acre parcel has been farmed historically, but had become overgrown until about 1990, when Mr. Ceppi undertook a major clearing project and restored the land to agricultural fields. The Ceppi Farm has been home to the Jamestown Community Farm for the last six years, growing beans, squash, tomatoes, pumpkins and peppers for local food banks and charitable groups in Jamestown, Newport and South Counties.
