Land agreement display at library

The Jamestown Philomenian Library is pleased to announce that the land title agreement owned by the Jamestown Historical Society will continue to be displayed in the Sydney L. Wright Museum until its new home is ready in the Jamestown Town Hall.

In 1657, 100 colonial Rhode Islanders negotiated the purchase of Quononaquitt, now Conanicut, Island from the Narragansett Indians. Before completing the purchase, the group met to establish how the land would be divided among them. This contract is known as the Quononaquitt Land Agreement. Multiple copies of the agreement were made.

This is Jamestown's first land title. The document details who got what land when the island, now The Town of Jamestown, Conanicut Island, then Quononaquitt Island, was purchased from the Narragansett Indians and divided among the 100 original purchasers. When property is purchased today, a title search is done to show a legal chain of ownership from the current owner back through the last 350 years to this first land title document of Jamestown.

The document is available to be viewed during regular library hours.

Poetry workshop announced

Poetry Night begins Thursday, Oct. 4, at the Davisville Library in North Kingstown from 7 to 8:30 p.m. The monthly event will be on the first Thursday of each month through June. All ages are welcome to bring a poem to share or to listen.
