Paul F. Barrett, 83

Paul Frank Barrett, 83, of Westwood, Mass. and Jamestown, died on March 15, 2007 of complications of prostate cancer.

Mr. Barrett retired as Director of Physical Plant at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1990. During his 28-year career at M.I.T., he administered a construction program that more than doubled the square footage of the Institute's Cambridge, Mass. campus, from 3,375,000 square feet to 9 million. Prior to joining M.I.T., Mr. Barrett was a senior structural engineer and project manager for Jackson & Moreland Consulting Engineers in Boston.

Born at home in Henniker, NH on August 10, 1923, Mr. Barrett attended the University of New Hampshire before enlisting in the U.S. Army in 1943. During his three years of active duty, Mr. Barrett was deployed to France, Belgium, Germany, the Philippine Islands and Japan. After his discharge from the Army, Mr. Barrett returned to the University of New Hampshire and received his B.S. in Civil Engineering in 1948.

Mr. Barrett married Anne Cus-tis Taylor in 1953 and they spent their honeymoon at the summer cottage in Jamestown owned by the bride's parents. After the Barretts moved to the Boston suburbs

in 1956, they spent portions of every summer for the next 50 years at the family's cottage on the east shore. Well into his eighties, Mr. Barrett enjoyed regular swims in the waters off Jamestown.

Town will again sell fishing licenses

Town Clerk Arlene Petit advised town councilors earlier this month that her office would continue to issue state fishing licenses as a community service, regardless of the outcome of proposed legislation affecting the licenses.

State Representative Bruce Long (R-Jamestown, Middletown) reported that legislation is being drafted to increase the license fees to help cover costs of issuing them. He said he favors provisions for half of the fees, ranging from

\$18 to \$40, to be paid to the town clerks who issue the licenses.

Petit noted that some proposed legislation enables town clerks to choose not to issue the licenses because some offices are too small to absorb the cost and work associated with them. She said she supports that option for clerks who so choose, but she vowed that her Jamestown office would continue to offer the licenses, regardless of whatever changes are made in state laws.
