The Jamestown Teachers Association and the School Department

The state Department of Transportation decided last Friday to downgrade the \$1.96 million construction project on Southwest Avenue to just resurfacing due to the possible presence of Narragansett Indian burials.

More than a week of rain and humidity have delayed painting the outside of the water tower, and town officials may have to extend the restrictions on water-use currently in effect.
