

Volunteers needed for town bike path design panel

Two vacancies exist on the Bike Path Design Committee. This new committee has been established by the Jamestown Town Council to facilitate the planning and construction of a designated bike path from the west side of the Jamestown Bridge to North Main Road and extending southerly into the village.

The charge of this ad hoc committee shall be to develop a proposed bike path design plan that promotes safety, protects natural resources, and is cost-efficient. The plan should also identify options to construct the path in phases to address funding limitations and opportunities. A report to the Town

Council shall be due 180 days from the commencement of the committee's appointment.
