### From the Newport Daily News, October 27, 1983

The state Department of Transportation will unveil two sets of drawings for the Jamestown Bridge Replacement Project at a press conference set for Tuesday at 9:30 a.m. in Providence. The renderings will depict the design of a concrete and a steel bridge. Representatives of the two architectural firms contracted in June 1982 to draw the designs will attend the conference.

For the second time this month, the state has learned it will receive a land parcel from the federal government at no cost. U.S. Sen. John H. Chafee announced Tuesday that the Department of Interior has decided to transfer a 7.6 acre parcel next to Fort Wetherill to the state for recreational use. The land will become part of the Narragansett Bay Islands Park system.

The School Committee voted 4 to 1 last Thursday against offering a school voucher system, but did not rule out the possibility of vouchers in the future.

Plans to build an emergency pipeline to alleviate the island's water crisis have yet to be passed on to the assistant secretary of the army so that he can activate the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

The ban on all outdoor water uses was extended for another 60 days by a unanimous vote of the Town Council.
