Richard Ellis Hull, 75, of Pemberton Avenue, died Saturday, Nov. 8, 2008.



Born at home Nov. 28, 1932, he was a life-long Jamestown resident, son of the late Merton Caswell Hull, Sr. and Charlotte (Ellis) Hull.

He was employed in the maintenance department at the Jamestown School, followed by many years working for Mrs. Sydney L. Wright and family at Fox Hill Farm. He served in the Army during the Ko-

rean War and was a past member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars. He was a Life Member of the Jamestown Fire Department, for which his father served as chief for more than 20 years.

He will be remembered by his friends and neighbors in Jamestown Village as Mr. Fix It. He loved to repair furniture and give it away, as well as fixing items for people. He was an avid fisherman, and had favorite rocks on the island from which to catch various kinds of fish.
