New shoes for the team

Spring means new horseshoes for the draft team at North Meadow Farm on Carr Lane. Nick Robertson watches as farrier Marciano Hernandez files the rear hoof of one horse in preparation for shoeing. Robertson said the draft horses do not wear shoes in the winter because they only roam the fields on his farm. In the warmer weather the draft horses will take to the roads as they pull the carriage, so they need shoes to protect their feet. The draft team typically gets new shoes every eight to 12 weeks during the pulling season, he said.

Library hosts Très Moutarde Sunday

The local group Très Moutarde will perform a lively concert at the Jamestown library at 3 p.m. this Sunday, April 19.

Très Moutarde was founded in 2004 in response to a musical "find." Bill Knapp, one of the original members of the group, discovered a box of musical arrangements of early 20th century popular songs in the basement of a consignment shop in Wakefield. The music had been used by the Spencer Orchestra, one of the small orchestras that played in the foyers and dining rooms of Rhode Island's resort hotels in the days before recorded music.

Sponsored by the Friends of the Library, the program is free and open to the public.
