100 years ago
From the Newport Daily News, June 3, 1909

The holes and hollows in the macadam on Narragansett avenue have been filled with crushed stone and rolled with the steam roller, putting the street in efficient condition for the summer. The work was done by Head, under the supervision of the state board, Narragansett avenue being a state road. This year's allotment of this town of new state roads will be about two miles, completing that road to Conanicut Park.

The fleet of small boats in the east harbor grow daily, among the latest additions are Mr. Sparrow's launch and Mr. Hill's auxiliary cat Psyche.

75 years ago

From the Newport Daily News, June 4, 1934

A lecture and stereopticon views of Gilbert Stuart's Work and Life will be given at the Central Baptist Church Friday evening.

The Y. W. C. A. Seaside camp at Conanicut Park has opened for the season and a large number of girls arrived Saturday to spend the usual two weeks there.

50 years ago

From the Newport Daily News, June 4, 1959

A dinner and dance to benefit St. Mark's building fund will be sponsored by the Holy Ghost Society Auxiliary tomorrow night at Holy Ghost Hall in Jamestown. Dinner will be served from 6 to 8 with dancing from 8 to 12. Music will be furnished by Louis Gomes orchestra and the dance is under the supervision of Mrs. Francis R. Costa, chairman.

From the Newport Daily News, June 9, 1959

Strict enforcement of one-hour parking restrictions on Narragansett Avenue, between Coronado Street and Conanicut Avenue was asked of the Jamestown Town Council last night by the Jamestown Planning Board. ... A letter from Philip J. McCafferty, town treasurer, requested the Council to ask the state treasurer that Jamestown School teachers be admitted into the Social Security system, retroactive to Jan. 1, 1956.

Six firms submitted bids Wednesday seeking the contract to perform extensive construction work to the Jamestown School. (The bids ranged from \$334,386 to \$383,670.)

From the Newport Daily News, June 8, 1984

Ambulance Association Commander William R. McCarthy told the Rotary Club of the history of the ambulance and services provided by a 40-member volunteer corps. Founded during World War II, the association has grown to a 40-member organization working on a budget of \$7,000, funded by the town. It responds to about 300 calls a year.

15 years ago

From the Jamestown Press, June 3, 1994

Whether the state should be allowed to use controlled blasting to speed up construction of the cross-island highway will be the focus of a special Town Council meeting Monday, June 6.

The final attempt to stop construction of the cross-island highway, which state transportation officials now hope to have finished by November, ended last week.

10 years ago

From the Jamestown Press, June 3, 1999

A flawless sky smiled down on the island's Memorial Day festivities held Monday in locations throughout the town. ... Crowds were estimated by (Jim) McLoughlin (parade organizer) and the police department to be "the largest ever," but no one could put a number on the turnout. ... Highlights of the Memorial Day parade included an appearance by the Jamestown Community Band and the Jamestown Fire Department's antique fire engine.

HELP IS AVAILABLE! The Jamestown Teen Center will manage a Teen Work Referral Program for the Summer of 2009. To hire a Jamestown Teen, residents must first complete a short, one-time application, accompanied by a \$10 fee, for a background check.

A Teen Center staff member will screen all jobs, refer a Teen worker and then accompany the selected Teen to the job site to answer questions. The staff member will also follow-up with a phone call or visit to make sure that the job was properly completed. Teens will be paid minimum wage with a 2-hour minimum. Teens will be paid directly by the Jamestown Resident. Tips will be graciously accepted but not required.

All Jamestown Teens entering the 7th through 12th Grades who are interested in working are invited to apply for the Summer Teen Jobs Corps at the Teen Center. Teens must pledge to abide by the Zero Drug and Alcohol Tolerance program and follow a code of conduct.


