PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE
TOWN OF JAMESTOWN

Notice is hereby given that the Town Council of the Town of Jamestown will conduct a public hearing on November 2, 2009 at 7:00 p.m. at the Jamestown Town Hall, 93 Narragansett Avenue on the following proposed amendment to the Code of Ordinances. Opportunity shall be given to all persons interested to be heard upon the matter at the public hearing. The following proposed ordinance amendment is under consideration and may be adopted and/or altered or amended prior to the close of the public hearing without further advertising, as a result of further study or because of the views expressed at the public hearing. Any alteration or amendment must be presented for comment in the course of the public hearing. The proposed amendment is available for review and/or purchase at the Town Clerk's Office between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, excluding Holidays.

Section 1. The Town Council of the Town of Jamestown hereby ordains that the Jamestown Code Of Ordinances, Chapter 10, Art. V. Nuisances, Section 154, as the same may have been heretofore amended, is hereby amended, as follows:

NOTE: words set as strikethrough are to be deleted from the ordinance; words set in **bold** are to be added to the ordinance.

Sec. 10-154 Feeding Wild Animals.

1. Definitions

- A. "Attractant" means any substance which could reasonably be expected to attract a wild animal or does attract a wild animal, including but not limited to, garbage, food products, pet food, feed, grain, or salt.
- B. "Wild animal" means any animal which is not normally domesticated in this state, including but not limited to, coyotes, foxes, deer, opossums, raccoons, skunks, and fisher cats.
- C. "Person" means any individual, partnership, corporation, organization, trade or professional association, firm, limited liability company, joint venture, association, trust, estate or any other legal entity, and any officer, member, shareholder, director, employee, agent or representative thereof.
- D. "Feeding" means the intentional or unintentional providing of an "Attractant" that is accessible to a "Wild animal".

2. Prohibitions

- A. No person shall feed or in any manner provide an attractant to any wild animal.
- B. No person shall leave, store, or maintain any attractant in a manner, area, or location accessible to any wild animal.

3. Exceptions

- A. The prohibitions of this act shall not apply to:
 - (1) Any person who is the legal owner of a wild animal and the wild animal is kept in compliance with all applicable state and local laws.
 - (2) Any person who feeds or provides food to a trapped, injured or unweaned wild animal between the time that the agency in charge of animal control or its designated agent is notified of the wild animal and the wild animal is picked up by the agency or designated agent.
 - (3) A wildlife rehabilitator license pursuant to [insert state specific code/regulation].
 - (4) Any person with a bird feeder provided the feeder is suspended on a cable or other device to make it inaccessible to wild animals, and the area below the feeder is kept free from the accumulation of seed debris.
 - (5) Any owner, guardian, or organization that is providing care for feral cats (as defined in Rhode Island Title 4 Animals and Animal Husbandry) and is making a reasonable effort to trap and sterilize the animals, if they are feeding the cats during daylight hours on platforms elevated by 6 feet with no supports that are climbable by coyotes (need vertical) and providing that food is consumed by the cats within 20 minutes.
 - (6) Any person feeding animals in the normal course of raising farm animals for food production or in the care of livestock animals, provided all reasonable efforts are made to reduce attractants to wild animal in the course of feeding livestock/farm animals and in the storage of animal feed.

4. Penalty

Any person violating this act shall be guilty of a civil penalty of not less than two hundred dollars and not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each violation pursuant to RI General Law 45-6-2. Each day that a violation continues or occurs will be considered a new violation for the purpose of assessing fines under this act.

Section 2. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized to cause said changes to be made to the Town of Jamestown's Code of Ordinances.
 Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
